* 1. What is the artwork title and name of the artist who was commissioned by the Al Bustan Complex in Abu Dhabi for this 5m long wall-mounted work?



1. ANSWER: *Folded Cosmos* by Caspar Fairhall

This large, wall-mounted work was commissioned for the Al Bustan Complex. The work draws upon the star motifs and geometric tiling patterns of Islamic art, as well as recent findings that suggest these medieval patterns anticipated mathematical discoveries by hundreds of years.

* 2. What city is depicted in this J.M.W. Turner painting of a 'cow-field'?



2. ANSWER: Rome

After the fall of the Roman Empire, the Roman Forum was abandoned and became an overgrown field as depicted in J.M.W. Turner's *Campo Vaccino*, which translates to 'cow field'.

* 3. What is this building called?



3. ANSWER: Guggenheim Museum Bilbao

Designed by architect Frank Gehry and nicknamed 'The Flower' for its organic curves, the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao has become one of the world's most iconic contemporary art galleries.

* 4. In what country was this fresco 'restored' unofficially by a member of the public?



4. ANSWER: Spain

Painted by Elías García Martínez, *Ecce Homo* resides in the Sanctuary of Mercy Church in Borja, Spain. An elderly parishioner of the church made the unofficial restoration attempt in 2012, turning the fresco into an internet phenomenon and the small town into a pop culture tourism hotspot.

* 5. What is the name of the Western Australian gallery where artist Penny Bovell exhibited a body of work based on a two-month artist residency in Skagaströnd, Iceland?



5. ANSWER: ArtCollective WA

Penny Bovell's work has seen her chase the contrasting weather conditions of monsoon in Kerala, India and most recently on a two month artist residency in Skagaströnd, on which her exhibition, Ice/land, is based on.

* 6. In what country did artist Kati Thamo take this photograph on an Artsource residency exchange in 2010?



6. ANSWER: Transylvania

This photo was taken in Transylvania during Kati's Eastern European residency.

"I can easily conjure up the memory of being in the places I visited," she says. "It remains a parallel reality which I carry around in me." * 7. This modernist building is the last civil work of which Spanish architect?



7. ANSWER: Antoni Gaudi

Known locally as 'La Pedrera' ('the stone quarry') for its sheer, cliff-like exterior, Casa Mila, is a modernist building completed in 1912 by Antoni Gaudi.

* 8. Which town pictured is the location of Artsource's longest-running residency exchange?



8. ANSWER: Basel

Artist residency exchanges between Artsource and the Christophe Merian Foundation have been running since 1989 and have seen nearly 60 artists make the journey to or from Basel and the Artsource Fremantle Residency studio.

* 9. What is the name of the artist who designed this permanent sound installation in Melbourne?



9. ANSWER: Federation Bells

39 inverted bells on stands, each with a mechanised hammer inside, play compositions and tunes written and submitted by the public. The installation was designed by Anton Hasell, Neil McLachlan and Swaney Draper Architects in 2001, to celebrate the centenary of Australia's federation.



10. ANSWER: Shanghai

Third Space is an ongoing creative research project between the School of Communications and Arts, Edith Cowan University and the University of Shanghai Science and Technology. The project connects students and staff from the two universities to develop collaborative artworks.

The 20m long *Cloud Gate* is installed in Millennium Park, Chicago. Artist, Anish Kapoor, was inspired by liquid mercury and 'The Bean,' as it's known locally, has gained international recognition as a transformative and interactive artwork that changes along with the environment it reflects and warps.

Housed in the former Bankside Power Station in North Southwark, London, the Tate Modern with its 99m tall central chimney, holds the national collection of British art from 1900 to the present.


* 14. Which city pictured is the host of the Artsource Artspace Residency?
